**VOTE ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8TH**

Catholics are called to see political life through the eyes of faith and to bring their moral convictions to public life. We should approach political questions not as Republicans or Democrats, liberal or conservatives, but as Catholics, because we should not try to separate our public life from our faith life. Christ calls us to be faithful disciples in all the different aspects of our lives.

Our moral responsibility does not rest within forming our consciences and taking positions. WE must also investigate the positions of candidates and vote on election day. When a clear choice does not exist between candidates on critical issues of faith, a Catholic voter should cast their ballot for the one they feel would best benefit the common good. Does the candidate support:

- Preserving and promoting programs that help the poor and most vulnerable members of our society?
- Ensuring that basic and affordable healthcare is available to all persons when the need arises?
- Programs that help pregnant women that choose life for the unborn child?
- Financial assistance to parents, especially with children in underperforming school districts?
- Religious freedom by protecting a right of conscience for providers of healthcare, education and social services?
- Repeal the death penalty?
- Policies that address protecting our environment and preserving our natural resources?

**MASS INTENTIONS**

The 2017 Mass Book is opened and available for announced Mass intentions. In an effort to have Masses available for as many people as possible, we limit each person to **three (3)** announced Masses. At each Mass, we pause to remember the intentions of all gathered so you are encouraged to come for Mass on those special anniversaries so that we might pray with you even if the names are not publicly announced. After all, it is the prayers that will be important, not the announcement. In addition, there will be one Mass per week for Parish Intentions, during which we remember the special intentions of all the people of Saint Thomas Parish. The stipend is \$15 for a weekday Mass, \$20 for a Sunday or Holy Day Mass. The 2017 dedications for the Sanctuary Flowers (\$100) and Sanctuary Candles (\$20) can also be taken.
