ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD TO SEND DELEGATES TO HISTORIC CHURCH CONVOCATION

Your Prayers are Needed

Guided by the missionary vision of the Holy Father's Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* or Joy of the Gospel, the Archdiocese of Hartford is sending delegates to participate in the Convocation of Catholic Leaders. The purpose of the national meeting is to discuss the issues facing Catholics in the 21st Century, and to ultimately equip delegates with tools and resources they can use to evangelize in their respective dioceses. The convocation will take place in Orlando, FL from July 1-4. Archbishop Leonard P. Blair, who as the chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis played an important role in planning the historic gathering, will lead a delegation of 25 people from throughout the Archdiocese. "My hope is that these delegates will bring back to the Archdiocese innovative and creative ideas to share with parishioners. For a parish to grow and thrive, the challenge is for every parishioner to realize that being Catholic also means being evangelical, a missionary, and a witness for the faith. This is what Pope Francis is asking of all of us," says Archbishop Blair. The Archbishop asks everyone to pray for the success of the convocation and for the Archdiocesan delegation who will be participating. THOMAS, APOSTLE AND SPIRITUAL TWIN



Jesus wants to return to Judea when he hears that his friend Lazarus is dying. His disciples protest the return, for the people were recently trying to stone him for claiming oneness with the Father. Thomas, the name means, "Twin", says to them. "Let us go also to die with him."

Thomas – a person of courage.

Jesus says at the Last Supper, that he is going to his Father's house to prepare a place for the disciples. Thomas asks, "How can we know the way? We do not know where you are going."

Thomas – a person of curiosity.

The disciples tell Thomas that they saw the Lord. Thomas says to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Thomas – a person of skepticism.

The Risen Lord appears to Thomas, and Thomas says, "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas – a person of faith.

We are twins in faith to Thomas the person of faith. There may be times when we must be courageous in confronting the wrongness of another person or in the most secret parts of ourselves. There are times when we may seek further the way of the Lord due to challenges in our lives. There are times where we may dismiss the hope of new life because the old life is too hard. Thomas was absent from the disciple who experienced the living Lord, and Thomas only comes to faith when he is in the company of believers who experienced the Lord together. We experience the Lord together in the Eucharist. We touch the Lord in bread and wine. We are sent forth together to bring this experience to those who are absent through our words, actions, and attitudes. It may take courage. It may take inquiring. It may bring on doubt. It will always require faith, and it can be done together. Blessed are we who have seen the Lord and have received him in our hearts. But blessed more are those in Southington who come to faith in the Lord through us. **St. Thomas' feast day is July 3rd.**
