**Father Joe’s Notes**



My dear friends,

I had a wonderful moment at morning Mass on Monday. As I stood at the altar and gathered the congregation in prayer, I realized that I knew the names of everyone there! (Lest you be too impressed, there were only six people in the pews; nevertheless, I knew their names! They were six names I didn’t know three weeks prior to that.) I will be struggling with names for the first year, and I will depend upon GPS to guide me around town for the next few months, but this was a good sign. It let me know that I’m adjusting. It means that you are becoming familiar to me, and that’s a huge part of being a pastor. I am very happy.

When changes happen, we adjust. We may not want the change, and we may not be happy, but we still have to adapt. We could lock in our heels and refuse to change. That’s adapting – not healthy adaption, but it’s a way to face the situation. We could begrudgingly make adjustments to our lives to face new situations. It may be more realistic, but it isn’t the best way. A healthy way to face change is to address honestly how we feel while still trying to be hopeful and positive about where we need to go. When we work to resituate ourselves, we may be surprised by the joy that comes when we meet new people or enjoy new experiences.

Try enjoying changes in your lives. Maybe you have moved; see this as a chance to make new friends. Your closest friend maybe be one of those new faces. Maybe you’re learning a new job; rejoice in the opportunity. This may be your true calling and bring you great satisfaction. Maybe you have experienced a death of someone you love; don’t feel guilty the first time you catch yourself laughing. Would the person you love want you to be miserable forever? The changes aren’t easy, but we must adapt. Who knows, you may find something wonderful and be happier than you ever imagined. Try to move ahead with hope and joy. It isn’t easy, but it sure beat the alternative of misery and pain.
